The Bravest of the Brave







Jose Francisco Jimenez





Rank and organization: Lance Corporal, U.S. Marine Corps, Company K, 3d Battalion, 7th Marines, 1st Marine Division. Place and date: Quang Nam Province, Republic of Vietnam, 28 August 1969. Entered service at: Phoenix, Ariz. Born: 20 March 1946, Mexico City, Mex. Citation: For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of his life above and beyond the call of duty while serving as a fire team leader with Company K, in operations against the enemy. L/Cpl. Jimenez' unit came under heavy attack by North Vietnamese soldiers concealed in well camouflaged emplacements. L/Cpl. Jimenez reacted by seizing the initiative and plunging forward toward the enemy positions. He personally destroyed several enemy personnel and silenced an antiaircraft weapon. Shouting encouragement to his companions, L/ Cpl. Jimenez continued his aggressive forward movement. He slowly maneuvered

to within 10 feet of hostile soldiers who were firing automatic weapons from a trench and, in the face of vicious enemy fire, destroyed the position. Although he was by now the target of concentrated fire from hostile gunners intent upon halting his assault, L/Cpl. Jimenez continued to press forward. As he moved to attack another enemy soldier, he was mortally wounded. L/Cpl. Jimenez' indomitable courage, aggressive fighting spirit and unfaltering devotion to duty upheld the highest traditions of the Marine Corps and of the U.S. Naval Service.

Declassified Study Puts Vietnam Events In New Light U.S. signals intelligence during the war came up short in major turning points, according to an NSA history.

U.S. signals intelligence — the much-vaunted ability of U.S. military and spy units to eavesdrop on the radio calls and other electronic communications of an adversary — failed at crucial times during the Vietnam War, according to a just-declassified NSA history of the effort.

The Department of Veterans Affairs provides hospice and palliative care to a growing number of veterans at each of its medical centers and inpatient hospice care in many of its nursing homes throughout the country. Nearly 9,000 veterans were treated in designated hospice beds at VA facilities in 2007, and thousands of other veterans were referred to community hospices to receive care in their homes. VA partners with community hospice programs in 35 states to promote hospice services that are not provided directly by VA staff.

Bill would widen penalty for defiling graves

A Texas lawmaker has introduced a bill that would make vandalizing the grave of a service member or veteran a federal crime, even if the grave is on private property.

The bill sponsored by Rep. Ted Poe, R-Texas, comes after the grave of a Marine killed in Iraq was vandalized just two days after his burial in Liberty, Texas.

"The outlaw responsible has since been arrested and charged with a state felony, but no federal provision exists," Poe said. Federal laws making it a crime to damage or destroy a memorial, headstone or gravesite apply only to public land, not to gravesites in private cemeteries, Poe said.

The Marine whose grave was vandalized, Lance Cpl. Jeremy Burris, 22, was killed by a roadside bomb in October while on combat operations in Anbar, Iraq. Poe said Burris, assigned to the 1st Battalion, 4th Marines, survived the initial blast and helped two other wounded Marine but was killed when a second bomb detonated.

This is not the first time the federal government has had to stand by when a veterans' grave was damaged. Last year, American flags were replaced with Nazi flags on Memorial Day weekend at the gravesites of veterans in Orcas Island, Wash., but the federal government could do nothing because the graves were in a private cemetery.

Poe's bill, HR 4973, was referred to the House Judiciary Committee for consideration. If enacted into law, it would apply the same penalty for the destruction of graves on public lands — a fine of up to \$10,000 and up to 10 years imprisonment — to graves on private property.

GO NAVY!

Navy Can See A More Powerful Future As Its Railgun Test Sets A Record

(Norfolk Virginian-Pilot, February 1, 2008)

Science got one step closer to science fiction, when the Navy used an electromagnetic railgun to fire a 7-pound slug at seven times the speed of sound. The record-breaking shot, witnessed by a roomful of VIPs via remote camera at the Naval Surface Warfare Center, also moved the armed forces further down the road to a faster, safer, lighter, cheaper form of firepower. The Navy's railgun is basically a long tube lined with two copper alloy rails. When charged by an enormous pulse of electricity, the rails exert a tremendous force that propels an inert projectile from the barrel.

VA's mileage reimbursement rate jumps

Mileage reimbursement rates for veterans visiting Department of Veterans Affairs hospitals and clinics will jump tomorrow to 28.5 cents per mile from 11 cents per mile — the first increase in 30 years. VA officials predict more than 1 million veterans will be affected by the increase



Veterans Eligible for Compensation

Tens of thousands of veterans forced from service short of 20 years because of combat-related injuries will be eligible for Combat-Related Special Compensation effective Jan. 1, 2008, under a compromise 2008 defense authorization bill worked out recently by House and Senate conferees. The CRSC payments would be set using the same formula as military retirement, usually 2.5 percent of base pay multiplied by years of service. CRSC would be paid on top of disability compensation, thus ending for these combat-injured the long time ban on "concurrent receipt."

Old U.S. Allies, Still Hiding Deep In Laos

Four decades after the CIA hired thousands of jungle warriors to fight Communists on the western fringes of the Vietnam War, men who say they are veterans of that covert operation are isolated, hungry and periodically hunted by a Laotian Communist government still mistrustful of those who sided with America. The CIA operation, from 1961 until 1975, became known as the secret war because, unlike in Vietnam, America's military involvement in Laos was covert. Instead of sending American ground troops to prevent a Communist takeover, the CIA hired tens of thousands of mercenaries, most of whom were Hmong, a hill-dwelling ethnic minority. Today, the number of Hmong veterans and their families who remain hidden in the jungle is somewhere in the hundreds to low thousands, the U.S. Embassy in Vientiane estimates

Bid To Replace Tomb Monument Stalls

A controversial plan to replace the Tomb of the Unknowns monument was put on hold this week when legislation requiring a report to Congress on the issue was signed into law, a Senate staff member said. The measure blocks replacement, but not repair, of the monument, pending a review of its condition and the feasibility of replacing it. John C. Metzler Jr., the superintendent of Arlington National Cemetery, where the tomb is located, said yesterday that he would move forward with plans to repair the weathered monument, but he added that replacing it was "still a very viable option."


